Members reviewed the response from Derbyshire County Council to the letter from the Town Council reiterating the request for a risk assessment for both Dronfield school children using the station within their school walking route and the designated walking route of the school as agreed with DCC.

It was RESOLVED to re-send the previous request letter to Derbyshire County Council and request a response,

It was RESOLVED to copy in the headteacher of Dronfield Henry Fanshaw School to the letter.

Members reviewed the response from Northern Rail to the letter from the Town Council reiterating the request for a risk assessment for both Dronfield school children using the station within their school walking route and the designated walking route of the school as agreed with DCC.

It was RESOLVED to write back to Northern Rail in response to their letter, reiterating the need for a specific risk assessment for school pupils at Dronfield Train Station, asking Northern Rail to recognise that Dronfield train station is being used as a daily school walking route. A general station risk assessment is not sufficient for a school walking route for pupils.

It was RESOLVED to copy in the headteacher of Dronfield Henry Fanshaw School to the letter.
